Rector's Letter

Dear friends

A number of weeks ago in our staff meeting we read these words from Ephesians 3:20 'God can do immeasurably more than we can think or imagine.' I wonder what is the 'more' that he wants to do in our lives as individuals and as a church?

In order to see the 'more' which God has for us I believe we need to get ready to receive it. Part of that is repentance. It's a bit like a spring clean. We generally get rid of some things in our wardrobes before we buy other clothes. We cannot fit in more until we have made room. In spiritual terms, preparing for the 'more' that God has for us, requires that we rid ourselves of the sin that, as the writer to the Hebrews says 'so easily entangles'. History would tell us that any time of revival is preceded by a time of repentance. Repentance, which is more than saying sorry, it's turning intentionally away from our sin and turning towards God, doing what He wants, is a necessary prerequisite to God doing 'more' in our midst.

Which leads me to ask the question - where do we need to repent? What could be 'a stumbling block' from preventing God, by the power of His Holy Spirit, doing more in our lives and in the life of this church? Whatever 'it' is, are we willing to let 'it' go for the sake of reaching others with the Gospel?

Whenever we do repent we are saying 'God I'm ready to receive more of you.' Truth is we need more of Jesus to be displayed in our lives - we need to grow in holiness, joy, peace, compassion.... As we do, we will know the transforming power of God in our own lives and in the lives of others because ultimately we want 'more' of Jesus to be seen in our increasingly secular society.

God can do immeasurably more than we can ever think or imagine- do we really believe this? Your family, your workplace, your worries and fears- God can do more than we think! If we really believe this, we will participate with God in it. We will pray it into being, we will plead with God to work amongst us, in this village, in our land, in this world! Someone has said 'we can test how much we really want God to work amongst us, by how much we are willing to get on our knees and pray it into existence.'

There's no limit to what God can do in answer to our prayers because His capability goes far above and beyond anything we can ask, dream or even comprehend. Our narrow imaginations cannot limit the richness of God's gifts!

If you've ever been blown away by an answer to prayer, then you've sampled the meaning of Ephesians 3:20. Paul was teaching his readers what he himself already knew, that it is impossible to petition God for too much because His capacity to give far exceeds the believer's ability to ask or imagine. No matter how extravagant we make our requests, God in His matchless power can do more and far beyond what our finite minds can imagine.


Kids Quest happens on the first Wednesday of each month and is open to all primary school age kids. Come along for craft, games, stories and much more.


